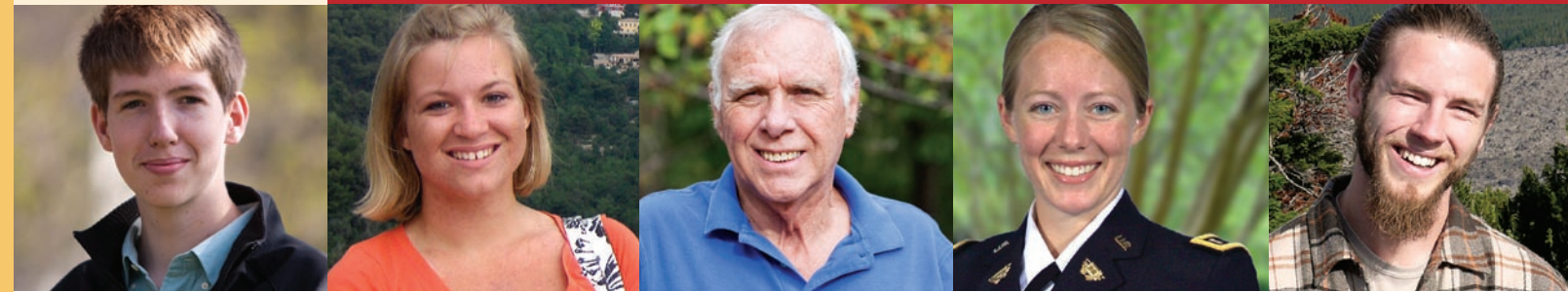

Four years ago The Albert Baker Fund received a generous bequest **that has allowed us to reach out to the entire world.** We discovered that the need was beyond our capacity to respond—and we are asking for your help!

We are grateful to be funding more students in the United States and Canada than ever before. And our new programs in several countries where Christian Science is growing are now running in high gear.

But we are still not able to meet all of the need...

- More students are coming to us for help.
- Students are requesting greater amounts of aid due to huge increases in the cost of college.
- Students and their families are working through some very challenging financial problems.
- Income from our invested principal isn't enough to fund all of the need.

And there is **more we want to do to help Christian Scientists ...**

- Christian Scientists in South America have asked to take Christian Science nursing training in their own countries, so we’ve begun to help fund the first Christian Science nurses trained in Brazil and Argentina.
- As we work with Christian Science nurses in South America, we are hearing of Christian Scientists who need help to progress on to college or vocational school.
- Christian Scientists in Africa, who had resigned themselves to the fact that college and vocational schooling was out of reach, are now reconsidering their possibilities as they learn about The Albert Baker Fund.
- As we work with our in-country representatives in East and West Africa, and get to know fellow church members and local school administrators, we hear of more and more qualified Christian Science students who are deserving of help with their education or vocational training.
